
comic strip summarizer


Objectives:

- Describe how a story's plot develops and how characters change as the plot moves towards resolution.
- Summarize the story in an effective manner.
- Analyze the way scenes fits into the overall structure of a text.



Procedure:

- Students will read a myth or legend in a traditional format.
- Teacher will introduce the idea of graphic novels, encouraging students to brainstorm pros and cons of this new genre.
- Teacher will focus students on the fact that each box in a comic strip is a specific scene that builds on the previous scene, eventually making an entire story.
- Students will summarize the myth or legend they read by creating a comic strip version of the story. They may choose to use the S-W-B-S-T organizer to plan their strip.
- Students will share their comic strips with classmates and discuss the way in which they divided the story into specific scenes.
- Teacher will lead a whole group wrap up, discussing the way in which each scene fits together to build a story. Students will discuss ways in which the story would change if a specific scene was deleted or altered.
