	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Developing Research Questions</u></b></p> <p>The student was able to write out research questions that allowed him/her to find important, relevant information about the individual being researched. The student was also able to revise questions in order to find more specific information.</p>	
	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Using Multiple Resources</u></b></p> <p>The student was able to use printed material and the Internet in order to find usable information, from at least two sources, on a single topic. The student provided a list of sources used.</p>	
	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Note Taking</u></b></p> <p>The student was able to determine the main idea of texts and rephrase this information into usable notes, summarizing the main ideas as necessary. Explain ideas, events, and concepts from the materials read.</p>
