The Starry Night by: Vincent Van Gogh

Setting sets the mood for a story. It can also change the way characters behave and impact the entire plot.

After looking at and discussing Vincent Van Gogh's *The Starry Night* and El Greco's *View of Toledo*, choose one of the paintings as the setting for an original story. Write a story that could take place at the time of day and in the place depicted in the painting. Look closely at the painting before beginning to write and refer back to it often.
