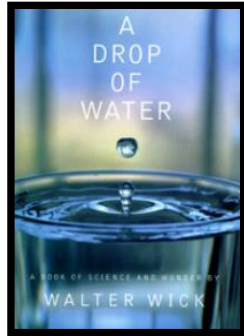


2 TEXTS = 1 TOPIC

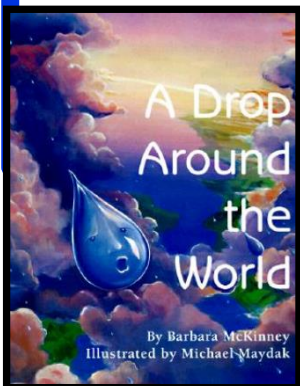
Objectives:

- Compare and contrast the important points and key details presented in two texts on the same topic.
- Use information gained from illustrations and the words in a text to further understanding.



Procedure:

- Read aloud 2 books on the same topic (ex: A Drop Of Water by Wick & A Drop Around The World by McKinney).
- As you read discuss the following questions :
 - What is the main idea of this book / section?
 - How do you know?
 - What are the key points used to create the main idea?
 - How are the two books similar?
 - How are they different?
 - What is the text structure of the texts? How do you know?
 - What text features does the author use?
 - What can we learn from the text features?
 - Do these books have the same purpose?
 - Would the authors of these books agree with one another? Why or why not?
 - Do you agree with one or both of the authors? Why or why not?
 - Does one of these books teach more than the other?
 - What questions do you still have after reading?
 - How might one of these books be improved?
